New Oral Gel Relieves Oral Lesions



Oral lesions caused by many different sources may result in oral pain. Gelclair™ (Sinclair Pharmaceuticals, Godalming,

UK) can provide pain relief by creating a barrier that shields exposed nerve endings from overstimulation during eating, drinking, speaking, or even at rest. Gelclair contains polyvinylpyrrolidone and sodium hyaluronate that form a thin adhesive barrier over the mucosal surface.

Oral lesions can be caused by medications (particularly chemotherapy), disease, radiation therapy, surgery, aging, and trauma, secondary to braces and ill-fitting dentures. The pain and discomfort associated with oral lesions can result in decreased ability to eat and drink. Gelclair has been shown to reduce pain and allows patients to eat and drink more easily.

Gelclair is available only by prescription. Contraindications to Gelclair include a history of hypersensitivity to any of the ingredients. Directions for use are

- Mix one Gelclair packet with 40 ml or four tablespoons of water.
- Rinse around the mouth for at least one minute.
- Gargle and spit out.
- Do not eat or drink for one hour after applying.
- Use three times per day as needed.

No adverse effects are anticipated if Gelclair is accidentally swallowed.
